Brook Sessions


This term, red pathway students have had further sessions with sexual health and wellbeing experts, Brook.


Salon Experience

Employability Skills at STEP's


Work Experience



STEM Cell Charity

Our very own Mr Kitson visited Class 12 to talk about his recent donation through the Anthony Nolan Trust. Mr Kitson was contacted by the charity in Spring last year to say that he had been found as a match for a person in desperate need of stem cells. In December, he travelled to Sheffield in order to undertake the process of removing and donating the cells. Class 12 (and all of us here at Catcote!) were very proud of Mr Kitson and had lots of questions for him. Did it ache?

Mr Kitson: Yes, it really did ache. When the stem cells were growing in my bones, I felt like I'd been at the gym all day but I hadn't.

Did it hurt afterwards?

Mr Kitson: I wasn't aching afterwards; I was just really tired. I had to sit in the hospital chair for about 6 hours and then I went back to my hotel, ate a burger and fell straight to sleep. I was just very tired!

Did you get to know anything about the person before you did it?

Mr Kitson: Before I did it, all they could tell me is that it's an adult woman and where she lives.

Woah, it was a girl?!

Mr Kitson: Yeah, it was and I still don't know anything more than that. After one year, it's up to her if she wants to contact me and let me know how things have gone. They asked me if I would be happy for her to contact me and I said yes. So, it depends what she has said. Maybe in one year, I'll hear from her.

What was it like when they took the blood?

Mr Kitson: So, when they were actually taking it, I was pretty chilled. I was quite interested in what was happening so I was looking at the machine a lot. Then, I was just watching things on my phone and the staff kept offering me drinks and biscuits. It was fine, I just had to sit there for a long time. I didn't mind it though. It was nice and quiet!

Did you have to have any needles?

Mr Kitson: Yeah, before I went, I had to give myself some injections in my tummy to make the stem cells grow in my bones and be released in to my blood. Then, in the hospital, I had to have one needle in my right arm and one in my left arm. They took my blood out of one arm, put it through a machine and then put it back in in the other arm.

How long did you have to stay there?

Mr Kitson: I got there at about 8 in the morning and I left at about 2 in the afternoon.

The video we watched said 4-6 hours. That's a full school day!

Mr Kitson: Yeah, it is a full school day. About 6 hours.

I could not sit still for a full day. I would have just fell asleep!

How did you get there?

Mr Kitson: I went there on the train. I had to go from Hartlepool to York then York to Sheffield and then I walked to the hotel. To get to the hospital, I got a taxi.

How much did it cost?

Mr Kitson: Well, it actually didn't cost me anything because the charity paid for it. The charity paid for my train tickets, they paid for my hotel and my taxi and then they gave me money for food too. How did you feel before it? I've been to hospital loads and I sometimes feel a bit nervous and sick.

Mr Kitson: So, I'm a bit weird. I don't mind hospitals. They're there to make you feel better aren't they! I knew it was a bit like giving blood and I've done that before so I wasn't too worried. I was just worried about sitting still for so long.

Hartlepool Masonic Benevolent Fund

Gold Standard Award


